#### **FELA Ballot Result**

The statutory ballot held for EIS members employed as lecturers at the 20 FE colleges which have signed the NRPA, and thus are party to the NJNC (national FE bargaining), is now closed. The results of the ballot - which asked members if they were willing to take strike action in pursuit of the NJNC dispute over the implementation of the March 2016 NJNC Agreement - are set out below:

The EIS Emergency Sub Committee has agreed strike dates; these will be communicated to colleges and members, shortly. The EIS would wish to resolve this dispute without recourse to strike action and we have informed the Management Side that we are willing to continue negotiations, to this end. We would like to thank members for participating in this ballot. The strong result improves our ability to secure a deal for members.

# **SQA Assessment Changes**

Following successful industrial action by EIS members in response to assessment-related workload in the senior phase, mandatory unit assessments are being removed from N5, Higher and Advanced Higher Qualifications on a phased basis from August 2017. The removal of unit assessment has significant implications for senior phase curriculum architecture and timetabling. This was flagged up to Education Scotland and Scottish Government by the EIS at the point at which the agreement around the removal of unit assessments was reached and repeatedly thereafter.

EIS is currently offering grants of £500 to support members to undertake their own action research Educational establishment-based action research is a simple set of techniques used to help improve teaching and learning. It is usually undertaken by the teacher or educator in their own classroom / setting. Action research involves:

- Identifying an issue (related to learning in your classroom / setting)
- Reviewing any relevant literature around the issue
- Planning a simple research strategy
- Gathering and analysing data
- · Taking action based on your findings
- Sharing your findings
