Many teachers have been in touch to state they are struggling with their own Health/ Wellbeing. EIS

Guest Speakers

Lane and Penny Gower spoke fully of the work carried out in terms of "The stand up for Racism Campaign".

Penny Gower also highlighted the challenges faced by EIS lecturers in Further Education Colleges and their plight at the moment where their contracts are being terminated and renewed with substantial changes to working and pay conditions. She urged members to provide support in this campaign.

Nicola Fisher spoke fully and passionately about the challenges education in general has had to face over the past year; the impact this has had and continues to have for the most vulnerable of families as the poverty gap increases.

She also expressed concern for all staff in schools given the new variant, which is proving to be a much greater risk. She urged all staff to message the First Minister and make the following points

*prioritise teachers for vaccination

*proper ventilation should be in place for all

*the importance of wearing surgically approved masks
