





STATUTORY BALLOT FOR INDUSTRIAL ACTION

The EIS has given notice to Local Authorities that we will be opening a ballot for national strike action on Monday 11 March in pursuit of the Teachers Pay Claim. The ballot will close on Thursday 4 April 2019.

As it is a statutory ballot, legally it must be conducted by post. Our independent balloting service will be issuing postal ballots to members home addresses on 11 March. Please make members aware of the nature of this ballot and advise that any member who has not received a ballot paper by 14 March should email ballot@eis.org.uk

This ballot is extremely important as failure to gain a strike mandate will weaken our position in the Value Education, Value Teachers pay campaign, and indeed our ability to protect and further members' interests.

As a result of the Trade Union act, we need at least 50% of members voting and 40% of the electorate to vote Yes. Not voting is effectively voting no.

Action for Representatives: Please advise members of the information above. Please also display the enclosed EIS posters within your establishment. We have provided 'I have voted' stickers to all school reps to share with members appropriately. The critical issue for reps is to maximise turnout. The most effective way to achieve this is to speak directly with members urging them to use their vote. If you require support of any kind, please contact your LA Secretary.
