SNCT Update

The pay agreement (SNCT 19/70) and new pay tables have been inserted with this bulletin.

If members raise issues regarding pensions or tax, please refer them in the first instance to the FAQs on our website.

Tax liability is related to the year in which tax is paid, although lump sum back payments may be taxed directly in the month in which they are received. Members will need to contact HMRC direct to seek an adjustment if a new tax threshold has been reached as a result of increased payment. Please note that the EIS is only able to offer advice on process with regard to tax, as each member's circumstance may be different.

There have been 2 in-service days agreed for 2019/2020 and it is the view of the EIS Salaries Committee that these days should be used, at least in part, to consider strategies for dealing with workload at school level. These two days are additional, and their use should not be directed by the Local Authority. They should not form part of current WTA negotiations.
