Forth Valley College staff have voted overwhelmingly to go on strike for a number of days between 16th March and the 13th May to defend their colleagues, the lecturing profession and the quality of your education.

Why are we taking strike action?

Forth Valley College management is reducing the number of lecturers in our departments. So far, the college has targeted members of staff in hairdressing, construction, engineering, and care.

Lecturers are being replaced with a new role - "instructor assessors". They won't be expected to have any teaching qualifications, they'll have much less time to mark and prepare students' work, far fewer days off, and lower pay.

Our working conditions are your learning conditions.

We're really concerned about the impact of these changes on the mental health and wellbeing of our colleagues. If we don't stop this now, the college will continue to replace lecturers and reduce the high quality education that you deserve.

We've worked hard to participate in consultations and discussions with college management. We've told them loud and clear: colleges need lecturers.
