Our employers have set themselves apart from the rest of the public sector by showing incredible empathy with their employees. Learning from previous experience of upsetting staff with their paltry pay offers, they have decided to spare us that pain by making no offer whatsoever.

What you do not know can't hurt you, right ...?

This failure to start the negotiating process despite our pay award being due on 1st September is intolerable. Your negotiators made that clear at the first dispute meeting in relation to this failure, in response to their request to postpone the next meeting until after the Autumn statement. This meeting is now not scheduled until the 24th November. Our public campaigning will begin next week regardless.
