The proposal for non-incorporation was formally included in the Shetland Island's Council Business Case report that was considered by College Lecturers' Joint Consultative Committee (CLJCC) on 6th December 2018. EIS-FELA Shetland College branch again stated their opposition to non-incorporation at this meeting. The Shadow Board who are appointed to oversee the proposals for the merger hold their first meeting on the 30th April 2019. Shetland College EIS-FELA Branch Secretary is delegated to the Shadow Board.
