CAMPAIGN TIMELINE

Shetland College EIS-FELA branch had first expressed their opposition with proposals for privatisation to the first merger project management group, Shetland Tertiary Education, Research and Training (STERT) in December 2014. The proposal for non-incorporation was formally included in the Shetland Island's Council Business Case report that was considered by College Lecturers' Joint Consultative Committee (CLJCC) on 6th December 2018. EIS-FELA Shetland College branch again stated their opposition to non-incorporation at this meeting. The Shadow Board who are appointed to oversee the proposals for the merger hold their first meeting on the 30th April 2019. Shetland College EIS-FELA Branch Secretary is delegated to the Shadow Board.



EIS National Officer sends letter to Scottish Funding Council expressing concerns about proposals for the non-incorporation (privatisation) of the new merged college in Shetland.




