Gwen Mayor Memorial Trust

The Gwen Mayor Memorial Trust was established in March 1996 following the tragic events in Dunblane Primary School on 13 March 1996 when the teacher, Gwen Mayor, lost her life along with 16 pupils of the school.

The Trust was established by The Educational Institute of Scotland, the trade union to which Gwen Mayor belonged, but the fund is made up of donations from teachers, teacher trade unions, individuals and other organisations from throughout Britain and beyond.

The Trust is governed by a Declaration of Trust and was formally constituted and obtained registration as a charity in Scotland on 17 February 1997.

The purpose of the Trust is “to advance education by providing financial support for **projects** in connection with the arts, culture, music or sport submitted to the Trustees by primary schools or departments in Scotland.” (Extract from ‘Declaration of Trust’)

Applications for funding are invited from **primary schools and departments in Scotland**. Proposed projects should fall within the purpose of the fund as set out above. Requests for full or partial funding of projects will be considered.

Applicants should bear in mind the purpose of the fund when submitting applications. While the purpose of the fund is of a broad nature, the Trustees will give priority to applications which are for equipment and materials relating to a specific project.

Applications for funding for general resources, transport or external staff or consultant costs are unlikely to be considered

The maximum award to any one applicant will be £1,000 and any application for a project whose total cost exceeds £3,000 will not be considered for partial funding. The Trustees will seek a reasonable geographical spread in the disbursement of awards.

In order to ensure that the resources of the fund reach the maximum number of pupils it is unlikely that those schools which received an award last year will be considered for an award in 2026/2027.

There is a limited fund for disbursement and funding is at the discretion of the Trustees whose decisions are final.
